WRVO's News Staff Brings Home More Awards

WRVO's award-winning newsroom picked up more honors recently at the New York State Associated Press Broadcasters' convention in Saratoga Springs.

Jasmyn Belcher earned one of the top honors, taking the Art Athens Award for General Excellence of Individual Reporting. She also earned a Special Mention for her feature story on ghost hunters.

WRVO's Mike Benjamin earned his first statewide recognition for his stories on the Bigger, Better Bottle Bill. He received a Special Mention in the Continuing Coverage category.

In May, The Syracuse Press Club provided a bumper crop of honors for WRVO's news effort. Jasmyn and Ryan Morden shared first place honors in the Spot News category for WRVO's election night coverage.

Jasmyn took both first and second place honors in the Investigative category, for stories on retired race horses and robocalls during a political battle. Jasmyn took another first place in the Human Interest Feature category, for a feature on a couple who run a food pantry for pets out of their home. Jasmyn, Ryan and Morning Edition host Jason Smith earned first place for Best Newscast for WRVO's 8:00 a.m. newscast on the day after the 2009 elections. And the entire WRVO staff shared a second place award in the Public Affairs Program category for our Community Forum on the race for Mayor of Syracuse.

WRVO Adds a Technology and Innovation Reporter

Beginning June 28th, Ryan Morden will be WRVO's Multimedia Reporter on Technology and Innovation in Central New York. Ryan will join four other recently hired reporters stationed at other New York public broadcasting stations in a major journalism initiative for the Upstate New York region.

Ryan will perform multi-media reporting to help you gain a better understanding of the impact of investment in research and technology projects across the region, the ways that colleges, universities and medical centers are working to create opportunities in emerging technologies, and other industry efforts to transition from a manufacturing base to a knowledge economy.

This is part of a larger project the Corporation for Public Broadcasting announced in March of five Local Journalism Centers, each focused on a particular issue relevant to communities throughout their region. In the Southwest, a bi-lingual reporting team from seven stations will focus on cultural shifts that are transforming the southwest, including Latino, Native American and border issues. In The Plains, six stations across four states will focus on agri-business, including farming practices, food production and fuel usage, looking both at local and national issues. In the upper Midwest, stations in three states will focus on reinventing the industrial heartland and in particular the economy in the upper Midwest. And in Central Florida, six stations will focus on creating multi-media content related to healthcare issues in their region.

Ryan will be leaving his Morning Edition Producer Position after working there a little over a year. This will create a new opening to be advertised soon for our news efforts.
